Scandinavian Heritage Day

Come and join the fun. Learn about the cultures. Learn about genealogy and Scandinavian travel opportunities. There will be vendors with Scandinavian Merchandise. The vendors include Freya Boutique from Solbakken lodge, Kristen of Copenhagen, Swedesign, and Joanne Hultstrand with her beautiful Norwegian Rosemaled items. Volvo of the Desert will be there to show you what Scandinavian design offers in an automobile. There will be opportunities for you to experience culture and folk arts. Folk art demonstrations include: Hardanger embroidery, knitting, Rosemaling and wood carving. Taste Scandinavian food specialties and watch food demonstrations. There will be a meatball, vegetable, and potato lunch available as well as a specialty cheese and flat bread plate. Various Scandinavian sweets will be available, also. There will also be rosette, lefse and æbelskiver demonstrations. Throughout the day there will be films of travel, culture, Vikings, and entertainment. Scandia Gammeldans will entertain with accordion and Hardanger fiddle music, and the Swedish Folk Dance Club of Los Angeles will perform. Louise Selle will perform several Grieg piano selections. Also there will be games and Scandinavian arts and crafts for children.

Norwegian Culture Skills Program

Sons of Norway's **Norwegian Cultural Skills Program** is a self-paced course in Norwegian art and culture for members only. There are currently 14 adult programs in topics ranging from rosemaled to genealogy. The Norwegian Cultural Skills Program gives members the opportunity to explore the Norwegian culture within a lodge-sponsored group, or as a self-study course that individual members can work on at their own leisure

The Four Tracks:

Members can work along four tracks of achievement: the Generalist Track; the Specialist Track; the Master Track, and the Mentor Track.

The **Generalist Track** allows the member to learn a little about many

Norwegian cultural skills. This is the track a member would choose if they would like to "sample" several Norwegian cultural skills.

Example: You may want to learn a little about Norwegian wood carving, Hardanger, Norwegian literature and Norwegian cooking. By completing one part of each of these different skills (generally Part I of the unit), you will be a "generalist" in one or more skills. The member will be awarded the Generalist pin with bar indicating what skill was explored.

The **Specialist Track** offers the lodge member the opportunity to learn in

depth about one (or more) of the cultural skills of Norway. Example: by striving to complete all 3 parts of a skill such as woodcarving, music or Hardanger, the member becomes a specialist in that skill and will earn the Specialist pin and bar recognizing that particular skill and as well as a bar indicating the level of completion. A member can change tracks from Generalist to Specialist at any time.

The **Master Level Track** provides recognition for the member who completes all three levels of at least 3 different skills as a Specialist, or nine individual basic activities as a Generalist or a combination of Specialist/Generalist. There are 3 levels in the Master Track: Bronze, Silver and Gold. The bronze, silver and gold bar will hang from a very special Master's pin.

The **Mentor Track** provides recognition for the lodge member who wants to

share their knowledge with others and/or guides other members through the Generalist or Specialist Tracks as defined in the Cultural Skills Program units.

The Awards:

The Norwegian Cultural Skills Program awards members that successfully complete the levels with beautiful recognition pins and bars that indicate their levels of achievement. The units cover a broad range of interests including genealogy, rosemaled, cooking, literature, and many more. All required materials are sent to the Sons of Norway Headquarters, they are reviewed and pin/bar awards are sent to the lodge Culture Director or designated person for presentation at a future lodge program. Please allow 6 – 8 weeks for pins to arrive.

Cultural Skills Informational Brochure

The brochure describes the Cultural Skills program and shows examples of the pins and bars awarded to members who complete the requirements. Flatbread Recipe served at lutefisk dinner

I won't call this flatbrød, as I'm pretty sure that this is an Americanized version. I don't think my great grandmother had "Total" breakfast cereal in Norway. That reminds me of a story. You know that Norwegians have breakfast of meats, cheeses, breads, etc. Breakfast cereal is a rather recent addition to their breakfast food selection. Twenty some years ago, a Norwegian relative family came to the States. Their American relative hosts served Cheerios breakfast cereal to the youngsters. Dag (pronounced something like dog) started to cry. He leaned over and whimpered to his mother, "De er føring oss hundemat." "They are feeding us dog food." True story.

I received this recipe from Margaret Swanson, current president of Soldalen Lodge #67, in Redlands, who brought it to Southern California Kretsstevne a number of years ago. She got it from the 100th Anniversary (1993) Cookbook of Trinity Lutheran Church, Thief River Falls, MN.

Total Cereal Flatbread or Cracker

2 cups white flour
2 cups oatmeal
2 cups *Total* cereal (crush finely after measuring)
¾ cup sugar
½ tsp. salt
2 sticks margarine
¾ cup warm water with 1 tsp. baking soda

Mix the first 5 ingredients. Cut the margarine in with a pastry blender/cutter, as in making a pie crust. Add water with soda to the mixture. Mix well and chill eight hours or overnight. Roll very thin (using both a regular and grooved rolling pin) on a floured cloth. Transfer to a cookie sheet using a lelse stick or a long, flat spatula. Cut into squares with a knife or pastry wheel. Bake for 9 minutes in a 350 degree oven. Transfer to a rack to cool.

THIS INTERNATIONALLY CELEBRATED CHOIR SINGS ACAPPELLA PIECES FROM GREGORIAN TO MODERN MUSIC AND LARGER PIECES FOR CHOIR AND ORCHESTRA. DURING THE PAST DECADE, THE NIDAROS CATHEDRAL BOYS' CHOIR HAS RECORDED TWELVE CDs AND OTHER RECORDINGS. PROFESSOR BJØRN MOE HAS BEEN CONDUCTOR OF THE CHOIR SINCE 1973.
